Farm Highlight

The 2nd year of contract growing with support from the Healthcare Initiative Foundation is fully underway! Just a few weeks ago, we got to see Niyi at Dodo Farms in Brookeville, harvesting over 400 lbs. of tomatoes. He then drove the tomatoes down to Clifton Park Baptist Church (CPBC) Hub to be shared via their food distributions. Thus far in their contract, they have delivered 1,000 lbs. of cabbage and 1,775 lbs. of tomatoes to CPBC. We're incredibly grateful for this partnership and the hard work Niyi and Tope are doing to deliver fresh produce to a Montgomery County Service Consolidation Hub.
