Ag History Farm Park Hubs

The **Compost Education Hub**, a project led by our partners the **Montgomery County Master**

Gardeners, is a site to teach the art of composting to encourage more residents to start the practice in their own backyards. This project is particularly interesting because food scraps from Manna enter the system, are turned into soil, and then that soil is used in the MG Demonstration Garden to grow vegetables that are donated back to Manna. The group then walked down to the Park building to witness the ribbon cutting of a **new cold** storage "microhub" that can be used by farmers to hold product for donation or sale. The hope is that this can **serve as an experiment to** test out the concept of combining a bunch of small orders from farms into one larger order that can be used by the school system or other vendors that are looking for a larger amount of product at one time.
