Over the past year, we've witnessed this painful reality thousands of times. It continues to fundamentally shape how we approach our mission.

The families who turn to us are working parents, seniors on fixed incomes, and neighbors managing medical crises or job loss. They're here because food is often the only flexible expense in an otherwise inflexible budget. But what we provide is more than just food. When we offer grocery assistance, we're helping families stabilize their housing, manage their bills, and—most importantly—receive support with dignity and respect.

In a time when the future of critical federal safety-net programs remains uncertain, your partnership has allowed us to act boldly and strategically. We've strengthened our Manna Markets so families can shop with dignity. We've expanded home deliveries for our most vulnerable neighbors and deepened our school-based programming to ensure no child faces the weekend unsure of where their next meal will come from.

We've invested in scaling up our SNAP enrollment work—because every family we connect to federal benefits is a step closer to long-term food security. But even as we do this, we know those benefits are not guaranteed, making local, community-driven solutions more essential than ever.

We enhanced our grocery voucher program to ensure families can access culturally meaningful foods—because food assistance should reflect the diversity of the people we serve.

As you read through this report, you'll see how your investment has helped build something extraordinary: a food security network that doesn't just respond to hunger but actively works to prevent it. Together we create bridges toward lasting stability.

You'll see that you've made it possible for thousands of families to redirect their limited resources toward rent, utilities, and other essentials—transforming not just meals, but lives. The effects of your generosity extend far beyond our distribution, creating a stronger, more resilient community in a time when it's needed most.

Supporting Our Students

The volunteer-led Kids In Need Distributors (KIND) joined Manna Food Center! We welcomed many new schools into our program, allowing more kids and families to receive nutritious food support. By the end of the year, we were serving 94 schools (8 with gift cards, 10 Manna monthly markets, and 76 weekend bags).

Expanding Our Partnerships

We expanded the voucher program to better serve the Vietnamese community through a strategic partnership with Vietnamese American Services (VAS), collectively reaching 160 new families. Through this collaboration we now welcome these new grocers into our voucher program: Hung Phat in Wheaton and Angkor Supermarket in Silver Spring.

In light of proposed cuts to USDA and SNAP programs, we worked with the Montgomery County Food Council and Maryland Hunger Solutions to share farmer and participant experiences. Some even participated in FRAC's SNAP Challenge. This week-long event provided a glimpse into what life is like for tens of millions of people across the country who struggle to put food on the table. We used this challenge to bring awareness to the fact that current benefits, which stand on average **\$6/per person a day**, are not enough to support a family.

Making Healthier Choices



Food As Medicine Partnership

Through a project led by Adventist HealthCare, 150 households screened by two local community clinics (Mary's Center and Mercy) are enrolled in a 10 month program where they can shop at a weekly free farmers market from One Acre Farm and receive a monthly box of nutritious shelf-stable foods from Manna. Throughout the program we are providing healthy recipes, cooking demos/sampling, and educational sessions like grocery store tours provided by Giant.
